

# Amelanchier 'Autumn Brilliance'

## Autumn Brilliance serviceberry



*Amelanchier* 'Autumn Brilliance' (the Autumn Brilliance serviceberry) is a spontaneous seedling of *Amelanchier x grandiflora*, selected and patented by Willet N. Wandel in the United States in 1984. It is a fast-growing, great solitary shrub or multi-stem tree with a wide vase-shaped crown. The cultivar shines in a consistent autumn colour, with little to no damage from frost and no damage from fungi.

Just before the leaves start to sprout in April, the *Amelanchier* 'Autumn Brilliance' blooms bountifully with racemes of white flowers. In the summer, it bears tasty, small red-violet fruit - a delicacy for birds. The autumn colour of the 'Autumn Brilliance' serviceberry is a strikingly bright orange-red.

For rich flowering and fruits, and for the most beautiful autumn colour, the *Amelanchier* 'Autumn Brilliance' should be placed in direct sunlight. Put the shrub in slightly acidic, moist, but permeable soil. The species is best as a solitary shrub or planted in groups. Not a lot of formative pruning is required; regenerative pruning can be done after it blooms in May.
