



Amelanchier alnifolia (Pacific serviceberry) is native to North America and was used there by the Native Americans for medicinal purposes. The Pacific serviceberry is an upright, wide egg-shaped shrub with a finely branched crown. It is a valuable species for ecological zones and woodland planting stocks, as it blooms early for bees and it bears a lot of fruit for birds.

Right before or at the same time as the leaves sprout, the *Amelanchier alnifolia* blooms standing white racemes. The species blooms longer than other species of serviceberry, sometimes for as long as a month. The leaves bud bronze, are green in the summer with a striking grey-green underside and turns to yellow-orange in autumn. In July, the shrub bears juicy, blue-violet fruit that taste sweet and of all serviceberry shrubs, these are the most suited for consumption.

The shrub thrives in direct sunlight in acidic to neutral, moist soil. *Amelanchier alnifolia* expands with root shoots and throughout the years, it can take up a large area. In gardens, the Pacific serviceberry has to be kept in check by cutting away the root shoots; in ecological zones and woodland planting stocks, the species has room to grow.
