TYPES OF PLANTING

Tree types: standard trees, feathered trees, multi-stemmed trees, solitary shrubs | **Topiary on stem:** multi-stem umbrella

USE

Location: park, in containers, large garden, small garden, patio, cemetery | **Pavement:** none | **Planting concepts:** Prairie planting

CHARACTERISTICS

Crown shape: ovoid, wide oval, egg-shaped | **Crown structure:** semi-open | **Height:** 3 - 6 m | **Width:** 2 - 5 m | **Winter hardiness zone:** 7A - 9B

ASPECTS

Wind: intolerant to wind | **Soil:** loess, sabulous clay, peaty, light clay, sand, loamy soil | **Nutrient level:** moderately rich in nutrients, rich in nutrients | **Soil moisture level:** moist | **Light requirements:** sun, partial shade | **pH range:** acidic, neutral (5.1 - 7.0) | **Host plant/forage plant:** birds | **Extreme environments:** tolerant to dryness

PLANTKENMERKEN

Flowers: heads, star-shaped, striking | **Flower colour:** cream-white, white-pink, green | **Flowering period:** May - May | **Leaf colour:** dark green, buds bright green, underside pale green | **Leaves:** deciduous, obovate, slightly hairy | **Autumn colour:** pale yellow, orange-red | **Fruits:** striking, edible, large, drupe, raspberry-like | **Fruit colour:** red, dark red | **Bark colour:** red-brown | **Bark:** peeling | **Twig colour:** green | **Twigs:** hairy | **Root system:** shallow, highly branched, fine roots, central root
