USE

Location: park, central reservation, in containers, large garden, cemetery, traffic areas, industrial zones, coastal area | **Pavement:** none, open, sealed | **Planting concepts:** shade-tolerant

CHARACTERISTICS

Height: 0.3 - 0.45 m | **Width:** 20 - 30 m | **Winter hardiness zone:** 5A - 11B

ASPECTS

Wind: tolerant to wind, tolerant to coastal wind | **Soil:** loess, sabulous clay, peaty, heavy clay, light clay, sand, loamy soil, all soils | **Nutrient level:** low in nutrients, moderately rich in nutrients, rich in nutrients | **Soil moisture level:** dry, moist, wet | **Light requirements:** sun, partial shade, shade | **pH range:** acidic, neutral, alkaline (6.0 - 8.0) | **Host plant/forage plant:** bees, butterflies, small mammals, birds | **Extreme environments:** tolerant to salt spray, tolerates air pollution, tolerates heat

PLANTKENMERKEN

Flowers: umbels, spherical, standing, unpleasantly scented | **Flower colour:** yellow-green | **Flowering period:** July - November | **Leaf colour:** dark green | **Leaves:** evergreen, leathery, polished, smooth, lobate | **Fruits:** striking, toxic, berry | **Fruit colour:** blue-black | **Bark colour:** cream | **Bark:** smooth | **Twig colour:** pale green | **Twigs:** bare, with lenticels | **Root system:** shallow, extensive, slightly branched, clinging aerial roots
