Tree types: solitary shrubs

USE

Location: park, large garden, traffic areas, industrial zones | **Pavement:** none

CHARACTERISTICS

Crown shape: narrow vase-shaped | **Crown structure:** semi-open | **Height:** 4 - 6 m | **Width:** 3 - 4.5 m | **Winter hardiness zone:** 5A - 8B

ASPECTS

Wind: tolerant to wind | **Soil:** sabulous clay, light clay, sand, loamy soil | **Nutrient level:** moderately rich in nutrients, rich in nutrients | **Soil moisture level:** dry, moist | **Light requirements:** sun, partial shade | **pH range:** acidic, neutral, alkaline | **Extreme environments:** tolerant to salt spray, tolerates air pollution

Flowers: raceme, striking, pendulous, big, scented | **Flower colour:** pale yellow | **Flowering period:** May - June | **Leaf colour:** green | **Leaves:** deciduous, ovate, ternate, Nitrogen fixing | **Autumn colour:** yellow-brown | **Fruits:** striking, toxic, pod | **Fruit colour:** brown | **Bark colour:** green | **Bark:** smooth | **Twig colour:** green | **Twigs:** bare
