Flowers: striking, singular | Flower colour: white | Flowering period: May - June | Leaf colour: green, underside grey-green | Leaves: deciduous, underside hairy, serrate, lobate | Autumn colour: scarlet | Fruits: striking, small, crabapple/ornamental apple, drupe | Fruit colour: yellow-green, green | Bark colour: grey-brown | Bark: slightly furrowed | Twig colour: red-brown | Twigs: hairy
