TYPES OF PLANTING

Tree types: standard trees, feathered trees

USE

Location: park, central reservation, large garden, small garden, cemetery | **Pavement:** none

CHARACTERISTICS

Crown shape: columnar, narrow pyramidal | **Crown structure:** semi-open | **Height:** 10 - 16 m | **Width:** 2 - 5 m | **Winter hardiness zone:** 5A - 9B

ASPECTS

Wind: slightly tolerant to wind | **Soil:** loess, sabulous clay, peaty, light clay, sand, loamy soil | **Nutrient level:** low in nutrients, moderately rich in nutrients | **Soil moisture level:** dry, moist | **Light requirements:** sun | **pH range:** acidic, neutral, alkaline | **Host plant/forage plant:** birds, humans | **Extreme environments:** tolerant to dryness, tolerates air pollution, tolerates heat

PLANTKENMERKEN

Flowers: catkins, discrete, pendulous | **Flower colour:** green | **Flowering period:** May - June | **Leaf colour:** bright green | **Leaves:** deciduous, ovoid, cordate, small, polished, lobate | **Autumn colour:** golden yellow | **Fruits:** discrete, few fruits, edible, small, raspberry-like | **Fruit colour:** white | **Bark colour:** grey-brown | **Bark:** furrowed | **Twig colour:** yellow-green | **Twigs:** bare, vertical branches, finely branched | **Root system:** deep, fleshy roots
